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





The 2017 AGM and Conference is to be held in Papakura, Auckland 20th and 21st May; full details can be found elsewhere in this edition of Trail Torque.

The past 12 months seem to have passed in a blur.....one of the main focuses this past year has been the development of a NZFWDA response to legislative changes, specifically the Health and Safety at Work Act which became effective from April 2016.

John Hickey led an excellent session during our last AGM / Conference and he has since led an Executive sub-committee with the objective of producing a NZFWDA guidance document which I am sure will be useful for both Clubs and individual members. This is an enormous undertaking and our delivery timelines have slipped a mite but there will be an update and further presentation during this year's AGM / Conference.

In the aftermath of the Kaikoura and Wellington earthquakes there seems to have been quite a lot of criticism about Civil Defence and Emergency Services rejecting offers of help from well intentioned 4 wheelers who believe they have the abilities and experience to get places when normal transportation routes have been wiped out. What we know is there are many NZFWDA Clubs throughout NZ that have excellent and ongoing

participatory roles with the likes of Civil Defence, Search and Rescue, and other Emergency Services including NZ Police and NZ Defence. What we also know. from those Clubs that have these connections is that regular training and logistical assessment occurs to ensure all involved folk participate in a manner that fits within the risk management parameters of the emergency service. NZFWDA view is that well intentioned, in the moment, offers of assistance will often times be rebuked by the emergency service because to engage untrained or casual groups to undertake relief work introduces yet another risk for the emergency service. If you just rock up after an adverse event your offer of assistance will be appreciated but more times than not will be rebuked.

The Executive believe many Clubs already have well established links with most of the above emergency services and we encourage all Clubs to work collaboratively to establish or re-establish links with their local Police, Civil Defence, Search and Rescue, and other emergency services. National and Zone PROs will be tasked to provide some guidance to Clubs to facilitate things in the event your Club wishes to be available to help when needed.

My (almost) 35 years of active participation in our great 4WD sport and recreation came to a rather crashing end in

November 2014 since then I have been unable to go 4 wheeling as I had in the past. In a rare moment of silliness I sold all my trucks, but recently those urges to get out and about have resurfaced so I have been on the hunt for something new. I made a couple of quick purchase decisions which didn't work out and I came perilously close to purchasing a Defender, but then found another GQ Patrol which, of course, I know and really appreciate. A few months of design and build under the artful hands of my good mate Shane in Taupo have produced an awesome truck which is now getting final finishing touches before compliance and then off to the WestCoast Challenge event over Easter. The anticipation of again being able to get out there and do what we all so enjoy doing is rather hard to describe but I am sure you all know what I am getting at; just the ability to be able to "do it".

My intention is to get back into regular 4WD trips around this great country; I've seen a lot but there's much, much more to be done! It will be great to meet and varn with like minded folk again after my self-enforced "retirement". I certainly look forward to that!

Our Zone AGM is due in the next few weeks and it looks like I will be returning as I have been unable to twist anyones arm to take the role of President.

Have you been to a Zone meeting? Visitors are always welcome and if nothing else you get to find out what other Clubs are doing. If you want to take on a more formal role you most likely will find that your Club will be happy to appoint you as the Zone delegate. As a delegate you will be required to provide a written (verbal is OK but something needs to go into the minutes) report at each meeting, these are normally held quarterly. If your Club wants funding or other support from the Zone you will be the one to present the proposal and answer questions from other Zone committee members. So come along and see how it all works.

### Off road

A late night trip up into the hills to rescue a motorcyclist in trouble. An experienced rider broke his own rules and decided to explore a track up into the hills. He had started this trip that would take him at least 2hours. At 8pm on his fully laden bike a Ducati Adventure 960, for non bike people like myself this is a big V Twin for

off road touring, this means it weighs a great deal, plus about 50Kgs of luggage made a big heavy package. At some point he slipped off the track and was able to recover from that, but as he returned he was forced to try and ascend a piece of track that was solid rock with no way past on the sides, by this time the clouds had descended and the rock was slippery and he was unable to ride or in his tired and distressed state unable to push the big heavy bike across. At this point he called the police and they called my Club. We arrived on the scene sometime around midnight, by this time the cloud had turned to rain several times and the temperature down around 5 degrees. 4 of us together were unable to push the lump either. Out with the winch and we were then able to move the bike. We stopped at the DOC hut some 5Kms back down the track and got coffee and food into him.

Then it was a simple but slow drive down off the hill and after packing all his gear back on the bike, off home and climb into bed a little after 4am.

### In the workshop

Over the Christmas break I tackled one of those jobs I was not looking forward to and dropped the sump off the P38 to hopefully cure the oil leak. All went well and the sickly smell of burnt oil was the only untoward thing I found.

Hi all, hope this finds you well.

Since my last report on the Northern Zone:

### Maratoto

As you may be aware after discussions with DOC and DOC being provided with Health and Safety documents by Steve Morley (thanks to help from Russell Biggs), DOC agreed that Steve and Ces Horan could carry out the work on Maratoto that was considered necessary before the track could be opened. (It is my understanding that DOC was only approving the work on the basis of a contractor (in this case Steve Morley) being employed to carry out the work.) Approval was only given shortly before Christmas but Steve and Ces managed to carry out the work and then DOC approved opening of the track and I gave notice that the track was open shortly before Christmas .

Points to note are that:

(a) Vehicles need to be clean before they go into the track and cleaned as soon as possible afterwards (but not in the river or at the ford);

(b) If the vehicles are not clean there is a risk that they will be denied entry or the track will be closed.

(c) DOC has approved use of cameras for monitor usage and DOC may want to access those cameras.

(d) We need to use the track and share it with others and not abuse other users.

(e) Since the track has been opened we have received a query from one club about what is meant by clean. Photographs were produced of a vehicle which had mud and dirt on it. I consider that we need to be sensible about this. If vehicles have mud on them there is a risk that we can be accused of spreading Kauri Dieback. So vehicles need to be clean on the top sides and underneath. No mud or dirt and no vegetation in or on the vehicle.

(f) We need to maintain a good relationship with DOC. If people try to take shortcuts the track could be closed and we would all lose out.

We are asking that the voluntary levy be paid of \$10 per vehicles and \$5 for each motorcycle. According to the camera there have been about 90 vehicles gone through the track as at February 2017 and we have received, since the track was reopened, about \$600 so not everyone is paying. If you see someone and you are not sure if they have paid please ask. The cost of the track work was \$5,000 so the user pays contribution is well short of the actual costs of maintaining the track (Association Membership fees fund this and other things!).

### Hull Road

Tony Burgess, Northern Zone PRO has been working to get the NZ Off Road Forum to pay over the money that we understand it has collected for work on Hull Road so that money can be used to help pay the costs of the work.

Waitawheta

Russell DeLuca, former Zone President and Vice President has been chasing DOC on Waitawheta.

### Insurance

The National President Neville Dunton and Russell Quin, Southern Zone President who also deals with insurance matters have had discussions with our insurers. An email has been sent out by them:

1. Quad bikes may be covered under the policy if they follow all the rules;

2. Activities covered are historical activities, club or association sanctioned events including minor track work i.e. club runs approved and recorded beforehand : 3. The insurance does not cover maintenance requiring heavy equipment or tree felling. The NZFWDA policy does 4. not, I understand, cover liability for heavy machinery or any contractors. So clubs need to make sure that any contractors have adequate insurance cover. The insurers point out that 5. associations, zone or club or members carrying out such work could be held vicariously liable, i.e. liable for others actions. At this stage on my understanding there is no cover for vicarious liability for such matters .

### Health and Safety

Grant Purdie of Wellington CVCC has been working on the Health and Safety documents for us and we are hoping to have a meeting to discuss this face to face in Wellington.

### National

The executive had a skype meeting scheduled on Sunday 19 February 2017 (2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> hours)!

Over Christmas I have been too busy working on our house and painting and carrying out other minor jobs on our renovations while the scaffolding is up! I also managed to find time to catch up on reading and read Duncan Munro's book A Farmers Affair The Legend of the Land Rover – very interesting for Land Rover owners. His comments on Health and Safety pre-date the new Act but seem very apt for all 4 Wheel drivers.

So whatever you drive take care!




South Waikato picking up the third round last minute and doing a great job and providing
