Kauri Die Back

(Phytophthora taxon Agathis or PTA)

I have for some time been aware of a major threat to our recreation from Kauri Die Back (Phytophthora taxon Agathis or PTA) which seems to have become much more of a concern in recent months. Kauri dieback is the deadly kauri disease caused by Phytophthora taxon Agathis (or PTA). Following DNA studies, this fungus-like disease was formally identified in 2008 as a distinct and previously undescribed species of Phytophthora. Kauri dieback is specific to New Zealand kauri and can kill trees of all ages. It is now widely spread and can be found in many parts of the upper North Island. Some areas of DoC land have already been completely closed to public access to prevent the spread of PTA.

Why should we be concerned, after all it is only a few trees?

Kauri plays a vital role in New Zealand's culture, history, landscapes and ecosystems. Kauri are among the most spectacular trees in the world and are environment-shapers; exerting a strong influence on the species that live with them, including humans. However, due

to exploitation, only a small fraction of the original kauri forests remain. Kauri forest is critically important to all New Zealanders, but it is also vulnerable. Losing all our kauri trees has been likened to losing all our Kiwis.

Concern that PTA could be spread by vehicle use is the main reason that the Wires Track at Maratoto is closed and with no indication of when it will open, or what we will need to do to get the track open, NZFWDA needs to act to ensure that we are able to maintain access to DoC controlled lands north of Raglan. There is a lot of information on PTA here <http://www.kauridieback.co.nz/> and elsewhere on the web.

How can we prevent the spread of PTA?

PTA lives in soil and transported by water on to the roots of Kauri. Work is underway looking at how we can prevent the spread of PTA and if you 4x4 north of Raglan you will need to know about PTA as it will have an effect on you some time soon. For now, when going into, or out of an area where Kauri live, you need to remove all soil

and disinfect any dust etc. (Trampers will already be familiar with the requirement to disinfect boots and dirty clothing) and keep off Kauri roots.

This issue won't be going away anytime soon. The requirements on 4x4 vehicles will only get more and more strict.

It was being taken away on a transporter as I turned up to the campsite on Friday night. That night in the tent was freezing but competition day was nice and fine.

Although we had a bit of interest in the Series there was only one new entrant on this day, he was a local club member and National Trials co-driver.

Central Zone Club Truck Challenge

DO YOU HAVE A REGISTERED AND WARRANTED 4X4 AND WANT TO TRY SOMETHING DIFFERENT??



The Central Zone Club Truck Challenge is just that!! Negotiating obstacles around a set of pegs testing both the drivers skills and the vehicle. This Club Truck Challenge has been designed for the registered and warranted 4x4.

Vehicles are grouped into 3 Classes Basic, Modified and Limited Modified (Class 1, Class 2, Class 3) A full set of rules is available - just ask. Flyers and information is circulated before each Round with relevant information. This is usually a day event. Accommodation or camping could be available for those that travel. On the day, each vehicle is scrutineered. You must wear a helmet while driving and the cost is only \$20-00 each event you enter. As always happens the New Year races away and before I know it I am thinking about the on set of winter; that period when truck maintenance occurs. In the midst of this period the NZFWDA Conference and AGM is held; this year in Wellington in May. Details can be found elsewhere in this edition of Trail Torque (page 13).

At last year's AGM there was a fair bit of interest in possible extension of NZFWDA insurance cover to include members vehicles. The Executive subsequently requested our insurers and brokers to consider extension of cover and also to review the scope of the existing Barleys cover (available via Auckland 4WD Club). This was put in place about 15 years ago. The intention is to provide members with new or refined opportunities for insurance cover specific to our 4WD activities and vehicle types. Hopefully we will have more details available during our upcoming AGM.

As a child of the 1950s I well recall our family summer holidays being spent at the quintessential beach motor camp around the East Cape, and Coromandel, and sometimes in the bush. These camps seemed to be everywhere, some free, some pay as you go, but they provided great memories of family camping.

Looking back now, most of those motor camps have succumbed to city creep just as many of our favourite 4WD tracks have similarly succumbed to changes in use, farming expansion, or policy changes by the landowners. Whatever the cause, it is abundantly clear that our historical access opportunities have been severely reduced. Population growth, particularly in the greater Auckland region, is a factor. Our national population has grown by more than 50% over the last 50 years but greater Auckland population has grown close to

100% over the same period. New Zealand is a relatively small country and rampant population growth changes land use dynamics very quickly. Add in the higher numbers of 4WD vehicles in the Auckland region and we can start to appreciate the frustrations experienced when access to our historical 4WD play areas is removed.

Changes in population densities throughout the country has also resulted in increased demands for access to land by other user groups, many who do not consider the concept of sharing the great outdoors with 4wds to be a benefit. So, whilst the land and access oftentimes remains available, the landowners acceptance of use has changed. Many of our historical tracks and trails are now off-limits to 4WDs but are available for use by mountain bikers, equestrians, trampers, etc.

The Association has been grappling with these issues for some time now and have also been attempting to secure a national agreement for continued access with NZ's largest landowner, DOC. Of course there are some local solutions that have been put in place by member Clubs and these generally work well but are often time limited. What NZFWDA members need are enduring rights of access to our historical tracks and trails.

For the past 10 years I have been involved with BOP4WD Club, in securing an enduring land use agreement with TECT Park near Tauranga. The Club, in partnership with Land Rover Enthusiasts Club, Rotorua, has negotiated an allocation of about 200ha of production forest within TECT Park but is unable to use that area until expiry of the underlying forestry rights. In meantime the partner Clubs have secured a sub-lease of about 130ha in the dedicated motorsport portion of the

Park. This sub-lease will end when the 4WD Clubs are able to relocate to their exclusive use 4WD area in about 12 years time. These arrangements have taken an enormous amount of time and energy to put in place but there is now an enduring arrangement for 4WD access, which, if not abused, will be in place for the next 111 years. The important thing to remember in respect to these arrangements is they are not free. The underlying agreement is a commercial land lease agreement which is managed by the partner Clubs.

Regrettably our historical access deals cannot be relied upon. Landowners change, population density and demands change, demands from other user groups increase, regulatory constraints increase and, unless the 4WD movement changes it's approach, I suspect we will find more and more locked gates or unwelcome signs in front of us.

There is an enormous amount of effort being put in by NZFWDA Executive in an attempt to secure enduring access agreements, particularly to DOC estates. These things take time and lots of negotiation but we are starting to make some progress. At the same time we are losing access as consequence of environmental objections or regulatory restrictions. These issues are not easily resolved.

The underlying message I want to convey is we are stronger in Association than as individual units (clubs). If we want to achieve continued access to land / tracks / trails then we need to mobilize within Zones and then present a united National front.

Stay safe, drive with care but determination, and enjoy! Neville Dunton

Authorisation to Open the Maratoto Track

Thank you for your time over the past few weeks.

As we discussed, I confirm that the NZ Four Wheel Drive Association in conjunction with local Four Wheel Drive Clubs has authorisation to open the Maratoto Track effective immediately.

To reduce the risk of Kauri Dieback, we would appreciate it if all users comply with guidelines and notices issued by the Kauri Dieback Programme (lead by Ministry of Primary Industry) to prevent and avoid the spread of the pest organism *Phytophthora taxon Agathis* (PTA) Kauri Dieback Disease as specified by the website <http://www.kauridieback.co.nz/>. The clubs and their members must comply with the relevant guidelines as specified on <http://www.kauridieback.co.nz/publications>.

It is important that all users of this track ensure that all vehicles and equipment are thoroughly cleaned of all visible soil and that footwear once cleaned is sprayed with a high quality cleaning agent.

In authorising the opening of the Maratoto Track, we understand that some minor vegetation clearance may be required and as such we authorise these works, provided they are undertaken in line with the attached Health and Safety Plan.

We also understand that the NZ Four Wheel Drive Association is considering placing some security-type cameras at the start of the track for data monitoring purposes. The Department would appreciate being able to use footage from these cameras for compliance purposes if the circumstances arise.

There are no legal restrictions on the Association putting the cameras in place. However, it is best practice that an easily visible sign be erected stating that a camera is presently recording (although the sign need not state for what purpose).

This authorisation is valid until 30 April 2016.






